Remember to use transitions such as: First, Next, Then, Nonetheless, Therefore etc.
- 2. Then, **either** draw a detailed picture of your favorite scene in the book **or** write a detailed paragraph that is <u>at least 5 sentences</u>, about your favorite scene. If you choose to draw a detailed picture, make sure it is Accurate, BIG, Colorful, and Detailed, (ABCD).

Math Practice:
