General George A. McCall School GOALS:

By June 2022, at least 70% of Kindergarten students and 50% of 1st graders and 2nd graders will score at target by In middle school (grades 6-8), no more than 20% of students will score below basic on the Math PSSA.
By June 2022, 80% of students will attend at least 95% of days or more.
At least 60% of Kindergarten students and 75% of 1st and 2nd grade students will make at least one year's growth, and No more than 25% of 3rd grade students will score below basic on 3rd Grade PSSA - ELA assessment.
