## **Summer Assignment:**

You are required to read the following book:

• The Unteachables by Gordon Korman Lexile Level:740L Reading Level: Middle Grades, ages 10-12

Use full sentences to complete the questions in the take home packet. This will be your first assessment in ELA for 5<sup>th</sup> grade!

- 1. When you have completed the book, please write two complete sentences explaining what happens at the beginning of the book, two complete sentences explaining what happens in the **middle** of the book, and two complete sentences about the **end** of the book without giving the ending away. Remember to use transitions such as: First, Next, Then, Nonetheless, Therefore, etc.
- 2. Then, **either** draw a detailed picture of your favorite scene in the book **or** write a detailed paragraph with at least five sentences about your favorite scene. If you choose to draw a clear picture, make sure it is Accurate, BIG, and Colorful and Detailed, (ABCD).
- 3. Write two **open-ended** questions about the book that someone else who has read it would be able to answer. An open-ended question cannot be answered with a simple one-word response; instead, it requires a detailed explanation.
